“I HATE YOU, MOMMY!” What To Do When Our Kids Are Mad: MODERN ANALYTIC PARENTING

Children become self-attacking adults if not helped to redirect blame outward. Modern psychoanalysis is the only school of psychoanalytic thought based on a coherent theory of the aggressive drive and its manifestations when directed toward the self. We will explore the tools parents can use to raise emotionally healthy children and some difficulties in doing so. Case vignettes illustrate the difference modern analytic knowledge can make in parenting constructively.

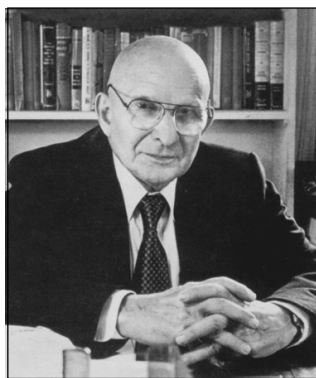

That an analyst's subjectivity may lead to an enactment represents a valuable pathway to understanding the patient's unconscious, and it is only through the analyst's subjectivity that he/she can arrive at a correct understanding of the analysand. This is a topic of neurophysiological research and of the analyst's desire to learn how such subjective reactions can be used in the clinical setting.
