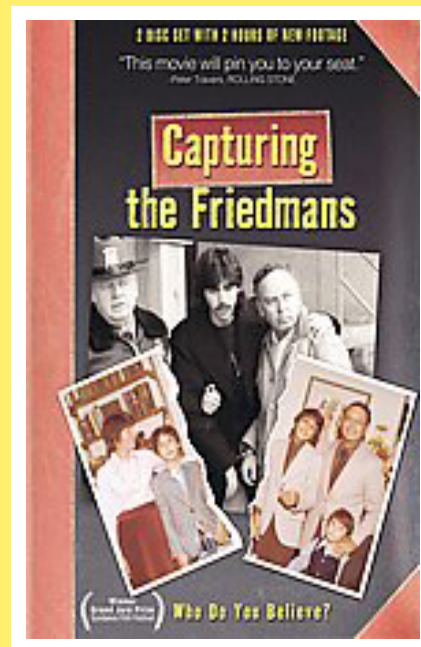
“Capturing the Friedmans”
